I had always figured I just wouldn't have a way to pay for it all. Mainly because to this day, my family has always lived paycheck to paycheck. I was the oldest out of my siblings, and I was hoping to become a role model for them. I believe they are even smarter than I am, and I didn't want them to limit themselves the same way I was initially doing. Being a first-generation graduate, there wasn't anyone I could turn to when it came to questions about college, so I also wanted to become that person for them. So, I decided to apply to Texas A&M but even with a good financial aid package, it was becoming increasingly difficult to believe I could afford it. After some encouragement, I decided to apply for Mission Waco's Wellspring Scholarship, and what do you know, I got it! Fast forward four years, and I'm a proud graduate with an engineering degree. This scholarship played a big role in my life, and I am truly thankful."





MISSION WORLD | HAITI

We have been serving in Haiti since 1984 and this year marks 40 years of investing in relationships! A Mission World team just returned from visiting our partners, Leve Kanpe, in North East Haiti. In 5 days, we witnessed: 100 women thriving in microcredit; 250 children going to school because of sponsors; 135 children receiving weekly food stipends; 6 new water wells used by 700 people daily; 5 broken pumps earmarked for immediate repair; and a new church plant - Redeemed Baptist Church.

You ask why would we continue to travel to Haiti all these years? Because "The God of hope fills us with joy and peace as we trust in Him, so that we overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Romans 15:13. Food waste is a big deal – about 25% of everything that goes to the landfill is food. Our composting program offers an alternative that turns food waste into nutrient-dense fertilizer that grows healthier plants and helps repair soils. In 2023 we composted over 28,000lbs of food waste!
