Creekside is Going Vertical








Community accommodations prevent isolation, which is common with individuals new to housing, and enhance living in community, which helps with mental health and substance abuse disorders. These two buildings will draw our residents together, from isolation to community as they share the space for cooking together, shared meals, and conversations that lead to connection.

Housing alone will not end homelessness, but community will and these spaces will help foster that community.















Heroes Fund

In Waco, about 15% of our homeless neighbors are Veterans. Mission Waco has arrived at a clear sense of conviction that Creekside must play a role in alleviating the homelessness of people who have served our country and our community through military service. We are excited to announce that we're committed to dedicating 15% of our homes to these heroes until every veteran in Waco is housed—but we need your help to make this happen. In Phase One, we're looking to fund 5 homes at \$50k per home.

Every gift—large or small—helps us build and furnish homes, as well as provide meaningful community amenities. We want to ensure safe, welcoming housing and community for those who served.
